



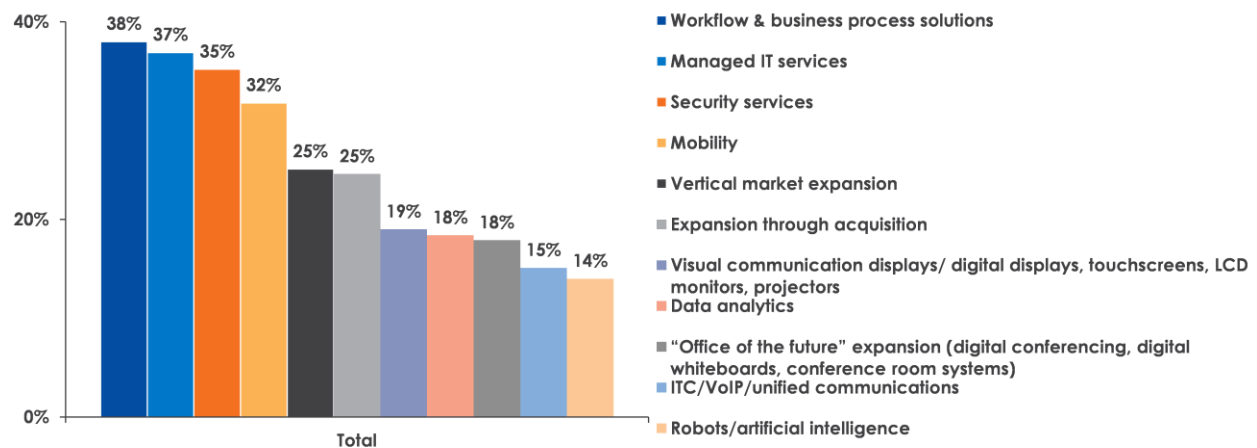
Managed IT Services for Data Backup and Recovery a Hot Opportunity
